CONSUMPTION OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR IN THE MARKET PLACE, GREAT YARMOUTH

Byelaws made by the Great Yarmouth Borough Council in exercise of their powers under Section 60 of the Food Act 1984 with respect to their Retail General Market.

Interpretation

1. In these byelaws:

“the Council” means Great Yarmouth Borough Council.

“Market Place” means the place in Great Yarmouth Town Centre where the Retail General Market is held.

“Intoxicating liquor” means spirits, wine, beer, cider and any other fermented, distilled or spirituous liquor with an alcohol content exceeding 0.5% by volume.

Extent

2. (1) These byelaws apply to the Market Place.

(2) Notice of the effect of these byelaws shall be given by signs placed in such positions as the Council may consider adequate to inform persons using the Market Place.

Consumption of Intoxicating Liquor

In the Market Place

3. Any person who consumes intoxicating liquor in the Market Place upon being warned by a constable not to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty

4. Any person offending against byelaw 3 shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.
